- 1. Articles are indexed by title, subject, and first-named author, with cross-references from co-authors.
- 2. Reviews are indexed by the title and first-named author, with cross-references from reviewers and co-authors.
- 3. All library organizations are entered under their full names. Material on the substructures of these organizations, such as committees, sections, etc., is listed alphabetically under the organization name, such as **North Carolina Library Association. Round Table on**
- 4. Reports of programs of the Biennial Conference are entered under the title of the program, the heading North Carolina Library Association. Biennial Conference, 2001, and the name of the sponsoring group or groups. They are not listed by subject, individual speaker, or reporter.
