NEW EDITOR ANNOUNCED

The appointment of Charles M. Adams as editor of North Carolina Libraries to succeed William S. Powell, who has resigned, has been announced by Mrs. Elizabeth H. Hughey, incoming president of the North Carolina Library Association. Mr. Adams is Librarian at the Woman's College of the University of North Carolina, a position has held since 1945.

A native of North Dakota, he did his undergraduate work at Amherst and received the Master's degree in American literature from Columbia University in 1945. His



library degree is also from Columbia Before coming to Greensboro Mr. Adams was an instructor in Athens College (Athens, Greece), a reference assistant on the staff of the New York Public Library, and assistant to the Director of Libraries at Columbia. His reviews and articles have appeared in the New York Public Library Bulletin, Library Quarterly, Library Journal, College and Research Libraries, and North Carolina Libraries. He is a former associate editor of the latter journal.

Mr. Adams is a scholar-librarian and is an authority in a number of fields. His knowledge of marbled paper and type faces is broad. He operates a hand press in his home as a hobby. His interest in books by women has grown since he came to Woman's College. A bibliography of the writings of the poet, Randall Jarrell, by Mr. Adams was published lass year by the University of North Carolina Press. He is a member of the American Library Association and has served on

the council of that organization. As a member of the Association of College and Research Libraries he served as president in 1950-51. He has held various positions in the North Carolina Library Association and is also a member of the Southeastern Library Association, the Bibliographical Society of America, and Typophiles.
